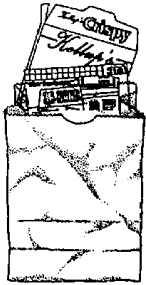


GUIDELINES

Curbside Recycling GUIDELINES information is for the cities of:

Boxboard



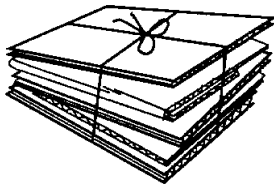
Cereal boxes, shoe boxes, tissue boxes, and nearly every box from your kitchen and bath.

Place inner bags (e.g. from cereal & cracker boxes) and plastic windows (e.g. from tissue & pasta boxes) in your garbage.

Flatten boxes and tightly stuff them into the largest box you are recycling or tightly pack them in a brown paper grocery bag.

*Sorry! We **do not accept** pizza boxes, waxed frozen food or plastic-coated (milk-type cartons) containers in your recycling bin.*

Cardboard



All corrugated cardboard (non wax-coated with wavy corrugation in the middle).

Remove all packaging materials and place in garbage.

Cardboard boxes and pieces should be flattened, cut or folded and tied in bundles not to exceed 2' x 2' x 1'.

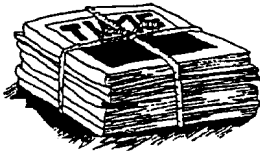
*Sorry! We **do not accept** pizza boxes, rice-based (yellow) cardboard, waxed or plastic-coated (milk-type cartons) cardboard in your recycling bin.*

Magazines/Catalogs

Rubber band or tie with string.

Telephone Books

Place telephone books loose in bin.

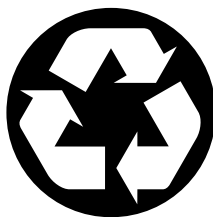


Aerosol Cans

Cans must be completely empty!

Leave spray nozzle on.

Remove caps and place in garbage.

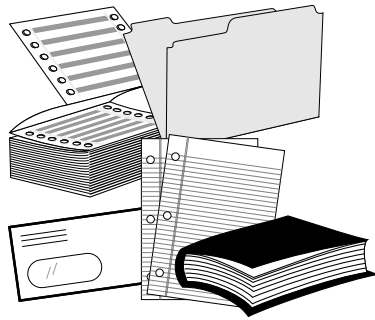

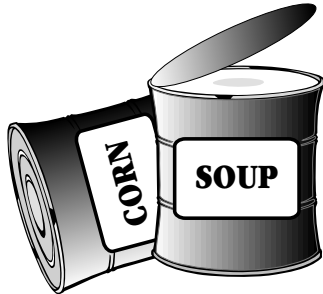

Mixed Office Paper Effective 9/1/04

Residential Office Paper, Residential Mail, File Stock Grade Paper, Envelopes with Windows, Computer Paper, Looseleaf Paper, Manila Folders, Paperback Books, plus... any similar materials.

New items may be placed loosely in recycling bin with newspaper or placed in a brown paper bag which may be placed in or against the recycling bin.



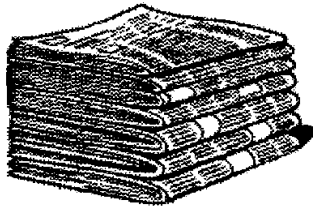
Metal / Aluminum Foil

Steel, tin, aluminum, and bi-metal cans.

Clean aluminum foil and aluminum food trays.

Rinse metal. Leave labels on.

Sorry! We **do not accept** scrap or other metal in your curbside bin.*
*Call RRRASOC @ 248-208-2270 for scrap metal recycling locations.



Newspapers & Inserts

Newspapers and glossy inserts.

No separating or sorting required.

Place loose in your recycling bin or place in brown paper bags.



Plastic Bottles & Jugs

All ♻️ and ♻️ plastic bottles, such as milk jugs, water bottles, and detergent bottles.

Remove caps and place in garbage.

Rinse plastic.

Leave labels on and flatten plastic if possible.

Sorry! We **do not accept** these plastic containers: plastic trays (microwave), butter tubs, motor oil or antifreeze containers, plastic bags or plastics numbered ♻️ through ♻️.



Glass Bottles & Jars

All clear, brown, and green glass bottles and jars.

Remove caps and lids and place in garbage.

Rinse glass. Leave labels on.

Sorry! We **do not accept** drinking glasses, light bulbs, window glass, mirrors, ceramics, dishes or cookware.
